Citation managers

- ▶ Tools to organize, store and retrieve citations
- ▶ EndNote is recommended for this course (and for SRs in general) because of its advanced features related to groups, deduplication, etc
- ▶ HOWEVER, free options like Zotero and Mendeley are useful in other contexts

Citation manager comparison

EndNote	Zotero	Mendeley
<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Costs money• Retrieve citations via direct export or manual import• Embed PDFs via Find Full Text• Strengths: customization, support, library size	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Free (can purchase storage)• Includes browser plugin to capture citations in addition to import or manual entry options• Automatically grab PDFs and archive web pages• Strengths: web sync, multiple formats	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Free (can purchase storage)• Includes Web Importer in addition to import or manual entry options• Very useful for organizing and annotating PDFs, retrieving citations for PDFs• Strengths: PDFs, social networking

- ▶ Duplicate *papers*, not duplicate *studies*

- ▶ Smith, J. (2020). “Appropriate prescribing of beta-lactam antibiotics”. *American Family Physician*, pp. 22-25.
